Finance Report 2/18/23

Note: There was no Finance Committee meeting on 2/14/23.

Financial Report: The financial start to 2023 was a little disappointing. Our income was less than anticipated and a few expenses were higher, primarily utilities, so we ended the month about \$2,450 further in the negative than anticipated. Remember that our current budget projects a monthly deficit of a little over \$4,300, with funds on hand at the beginning of the year available to cover any shortfall. On a positive note, we only had to transfer \$1,500 from our Money Market account to the Operating account in January.

Additionally, halfway through February our income from offerings and restitution payments is nearly \$22,000. Our monthly budget is \$28,850.

Audit: Gail and I attended a Zoom class on Local Church Audit's in mid-January. The class was given by our friend Rev. Robert Cox. We will have more information on that in coming days.
